Modern Slavery Policy for Ei Projects

Policy Overview

Due Diligence: We will undertake due diligence when considering new suppliers, and regularly review our existing suppliers. **Training:** To ensure a high level of understanding of the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking in our supply chains and our business, we will provide training to relevant members of staff.

Actions

Supplier Audits: We will conduct audits of suppliers to evaluate their compliance with our standards for modern slavery and human trafficking.

Contractual Requirements: All contracts with suppliers will explicitly prohibit modern slavery and human trafficking and require suppliers to comply with our Code of Conduct.

Reporting Mechanisms: A system for reporting concerns about compliance with this policy or the risk of modern slavery in parts of our business or supply chains without fear of retaliation.

Continuous Improvement: We will continuously review and improve our practices to prevent acts of modern slavery and human trafficking.

Review

This policy will be reviewed annually and updated as necessary to reflect our ongoing commitment to eradicating modern slavery from our operations and supply chain. The Board of Directors will be involved in reviewing the effectiveness of the policy implementation.
